

ACTIVITY REPORT

1st April 2020 to 31st March 2021

A. COVID RESPONSE

We conducted a dry ration distribution program as Covid Relief Program at nearby Adalpur Tea Estate among affected, poor, and needy tribal 100 families.

We also provided necessities like sanitizers and masks.

Awareness Program on protection against Covid was also provided to the beneficiaries.



B. CHILDREN CAMP & FEEDING PROGRAMME:

We earmarked two locations in Patharghata Gram Panchayat, where around 150 children of poor and needy tribal families were provided with food items as well as toys and stationery as well as warm clothing.

We also taught the children about basic health and hygiene, Covid awareness, living in peace and harmony and awareness about the importance of education.



C. TRAININGS AND SEMINARS:

Due to the pandemic, there have been very few contact activities held this fiscal year. However, we have had a few online activities and trainings conducted.

The regular trainings and activities held on Saturdays have been shifted to an online medium, with about only five or six students meeting at the venue once a month for hands-on training.

The following sessions/classes have been held through Zoom:

- Managing stress in a lockdown situation
- Positive and negative impact of constantly using Mobiles
- Career Guidance and Counseling
- Using hobbies, interests and skills for earning money
- Planning and setting up a small home business
- Skills and basic etiquette required in the workplace



A few online GK Quiz contests have also been organized with winners winning simple items like stationery and food items. The prizes were delivered to their homes.

There were a few activities organized in the LWC campus itself. Covid-19 protocol was strictly followed with everyone wearing masks and using sanitizers.

A gaming tournament was held in the campus with only participants and volunteers present. The tournament was streamed online so that other students could also watch it. After the tournament, a volunteer, who was a gaming addict but overcame the addiction, spoke on the impact of excessive gaming on studies and everyday life. He encouraged the students to learn to limit their gaming time so as to build a healthy social, mental and physical life.



Vocational Training:



- Living Word Centre has conducted vocational training on Bio-Floc Fishery program as a demonstration for the locals. A pilot project has been set up for the trainees to have a hands-on experience.
- The Piggery at LWC is thriving well and there have been many short hands-on sessions with only two-three people at a time. The eager students were taught the basic knowhow of pig-rearing.



Higher level Training on Leadership:

- Living Word centre conducted a specialized seminars in association with World Vision India on skills development and human trafficking and substance abuse awareness. Around 35 people are benefited each year by these specialized trainings.

1. Conference and Seminars:

- **Youth conference** on career guidance and pressing issues on social media abuse, peer pressure, drug abuse, etc. was held.



Men's Conference about family issues and men's leadership in the family has been conducted on social awareness programme on HIV-AIDS, Substance abuse, human trafficking, ill effects of social media etc.

D. Contribution towards the poor and needy: (Relief Program)

- Help was extended for family support to poor and needy families.
- Help was also extended to needy children through the distribution of stationeries and books.



E. Medical Relief:

The Covid pandemic was responsible in affecting many families who could not avail of immediate and basic medication. Thus, Living Word Centre took initiative to provide the basic medication to the needy ones.



F. Establishment Expenses:

Basic maintenance of the facilities used as a office by Living Word Centre.
